

Purpose of the Feasibility Study

Identify the most feasible route options for completing a network gap in the Potomac Heritage National Scenic Trail (PHNST) in Loudoun County, Virginia.

The project is a partnership between the Northern Virginia Regional Commission, Loudoun County and the National Park Service to identify, assess, and present the feasibility of potential routes in the PHNST corridor, including considerations for trail construction, maintenance, accessibility, park connections, scenic views, and other key elements for trail development.




